

**Introducing Sally Szwed, Eyebeam's New Director of Programs.

Eyebeam is excited to announce that Sally Szwed will join the organization as Director of Programs. This newly created role will begin mid-November.

"I have long admired Eyebeam for nurturing groundbreaking art and thought, as well as providing a critical space for artists to push the boundaries of what is possible," Szwed says. "I am honored to join such an esteemed team as Director of Programs."

Sally Szwed joins Eyebeam after six years at public arts nonprofit Creative Time, where she served as Director of the Creative Time Summit, an annual international convening at the intersection of art and politics. During her tenure she grew the Summit in both scale and ambition, traveling iterations of the program to Stockholm, Washington DC, Toronto, Athens, and Venice as part of the 56th Venice Biennale.



Prior to her role at Creative Time, Szwed served as Program Manager of EFA Project Space, at the Elizabeth Foundation for the Arts in New York City, where she produced exhibitions and public programs. She currently co-chairs the Board of Directors of Flux Factory, a non-profit artist in residence program and community space. She holds a BFA in Sculpture from Syracuse University, and an MA in Curatorial Practice from California College of the Arts.

In Eyebeam's new Bushwick home, Szwed will be responsible for creating innovative programs that engage civil society and technology through public artist-led events. "Together, we will embark on a fresh chapter for Eyebeam in its new home. I hope to build upon the formidable history and values of the organization, engage alumni and Eyebeam's expanded community, as well as form new relationships, both locally and internationally. I look forward to creating an active public hub for discourse, experimentation, community building, and invention as Eyebeam continually expands the role of art and technology in unpredictable times."
